

Mayo Clinic Health System — Chippewa Valley

In the late 1950s, community leaders had a vision to build a hospital in Bloomer to provide personalized medical care for Bloomer and the surrounding communities. The vision became reality on Oct. 1, 1961, when they dedicated the newly constructed Bloomer Community Memorial Hospital.

The hospital's board of directors monitored changes in health care and saw benefits with affiliating with Luther Hospital in 1982. This affiliation and the later affiliation with Mayo Clinic Health System in 2007 has helped the Bloomer hospital continue to serve the needs of the community by advancing technology, improving buildings and grounds, and recruiting physicians. These affiliations now provide the community with direct access to highly specialized Mayo Clinic care, if needed.

Today, Bloomer hospital is known as Mayo Clinic Health System — Chippewa Valley, which consists of the clinic and hospital in Bloomer and clinic in Chippewa Falls. Mayo Clinic Health System in Northwest Wisconsin has hospitals in Barron, Bloomer, Eau Claire, Menomonie and Osseo.
